The following is the Manager's report regarding activities in the month of August 2013:

The Town Welcomes:

Steve Diacik and Jonathan Rivero in the Maintenance Department. My appreciation to our ever-persevering maintenance crew who have accomplished a tremendous amount in the last several years with limited staffing. You are the 'glue' that keeps the buildings intact, equipment/tools in repair and the Town premises looking groomed so we can come to work every day in well-maintain facilities and do good things for our community. We also have a new Marshal Deputy Daniel Jacobs who we are glad to have joined us.

Town Budget Supports Sedona Recycles

In FY 13/14 the Town of Camp Verde was able to, again, provide funding to Sedona Recycles (SR) a non-profit, recycling center. SR's provides a tremendous service to our community by accepting many recycling items that others do not. Additionally, they also provide and educational outreach to the citizenry with respect to recycling. It is through this commitment by the Town and Sedona Recycles that we continue to have bins in the Basha's parking lot and next to the High School.

SR 260 widening project (Thousand Trails)

Recently, most of the Verde Valley entities met at a quarterly Intergovernmental meeting. Staff has reached out to those local entities who were unable to attend the Intergovernmental meeting so we could obtain their feedback on this project. Our next step/goal is to prepare/refine an Intergovernmental Agreement that communicates our collective desires; to provide the most efficient and safe travel construction that simultaneously improves the economic lifeline to our rural communities. This is expected to be completed by the end of this year so that design work can begin by the first of next year with again, construction planned for sometime after July of 2015.

League of Arizona Cities and Towns (LACT)

LACT visits Camp Verde

LACT staff including Ken Strobeck and Rene Guillen traveled to Camp Verde to provide an update of the major issues from the 2013 legislative session and their impact on cities and towns. Additionally, they presented the League services, 'AZ Cities at Work' web campaign and upcoming events and trainings.

LACT Conference Highlights

The majority of the Town Council and a few staff members attended the conference. The conference was a wonderful opportunity to network and exchange ideas with our colleagues and learn how other entities are structured. This year's conference theme, "Arizona Cities and Towns @ Work," demonstrated the unique ways in which Arizona's municipalities are meeting the needs of its citizens.

The LACT offered a session on the Wildfire Management and its Impact on Arizona's Economy: A Rural Perspective. Given that Arizona has experienced many *forest fires recently, discussion included information on background/mismanagement of resources and its impact on economy as well as information on federal legislation to help prevent catastrophic wildfires in our state.

Andy Groseta, a well-known local rancher and immediate Past President of Arizona Cattle Growers Association spoke on "Save Arizona's Forest Environment (SAFE) Plan. The goal of the SAFE Plan is to streamline the NEPA process in reducing fuel loads in our forests while improving the health and encouraging economic development in our rural communities.

*The Wallow Fire, the largest in 2011, impacted 100 ranching families and displaced approximately 18,000 head of cows and calves.

Finally, it was a great moment of pride as one of our own Vice Mayor Jackie Baker received her 12 year service award. Thanks for your many years of service to the citizens of Camp Verde!

Monthly Report for August 2013 ~

The League of Arizona Cities and Towns has provided links on their web for various trainings they have conducted. Staff viewed the Open Meeting Law Training with Bills Sims and Joni Hoffman Staff also viewed Public Records Training with Glenn S. Cook. Debbie Barber attended the League Conference in Oro Valley.

Business Licenses – We processed 2 new business licenses and 31 renewals during the month of August, bringing our total business licenses on file to 644.

Liquor Licenses – We posted two Liquor License Applications in August and one Special Event Liquor License.

Special Events – Staff worked with the promoters for Special Events including, Patriots Day.

Information Requests/Research Hours – We had 10 in-house (Staff & Council) requests for information requiring 2 hours of research time, and no public requests.

Citizen Complaints – There was no formal complaints filed in August.

Customer Assistance – The month of August averaged 30 customer assistance contacts per day with a total of 660 phone calls and visitors for the month. We continue to get several phone calls for the Chamber of Commerce and question each caller to see if the Visitor Center can be of assistance.

August memorable phone call:

A man telephoned the office to let us know he was stuck in Flagstaff and was requesting a police escort, we apologize to the Marshal's Office but that is where we transferred the call.

One lady phoned and wanted to know where the 'restaurant' was? I asked her which restaurant she was referring to, since we have several, and she let me know that there is only ONE in Camp Verde and the name of it is "Restaurant"

Meetings – There were five scheduled Council meetings in August, for which we prepared notices, agendas, packets, minutes, addenda, amendments, green sheets, etc. We posted four public notice.

Ordinances and Resolutions – We did not process any new Resolutions or Ordinances during August.

Records Management – While the Council attended the League Conference, the Clerk's Office took full advantage of the time by working in the file room and hyperlinking over 1,280 documents for easier retrieval. Staff is also working on the summary index and hyperlinking all the approved minutes. We are hoping for a 'one stop shopping' for the other departments when they are attempting to do research and locate documents. The Clerk's office is in the final phase of our Essential Records list and should have it sent off to the Department of Library and Archives by the end of September.

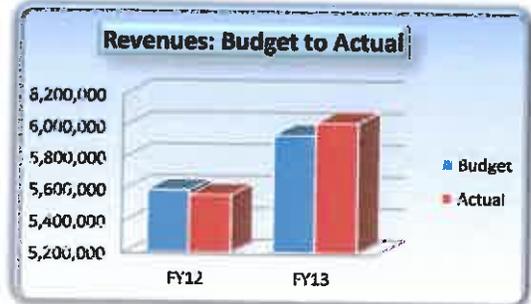

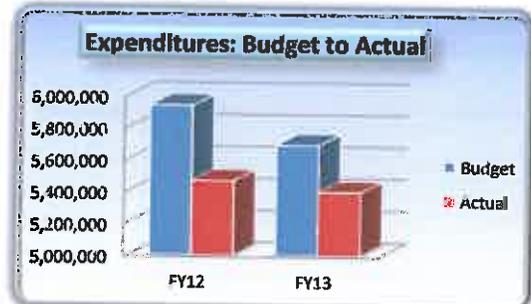

Preliminary General Fund revenue numbers finish the year comfortably at 1% over-budget. Local Sales Taxes remained strong through the end of the year and finish 6% over budget. Although Court Fines are significantly under budget at 41%, the actual shortage of \$124,308 was easily covered by other line item overages.

GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES by DEPARTMENT

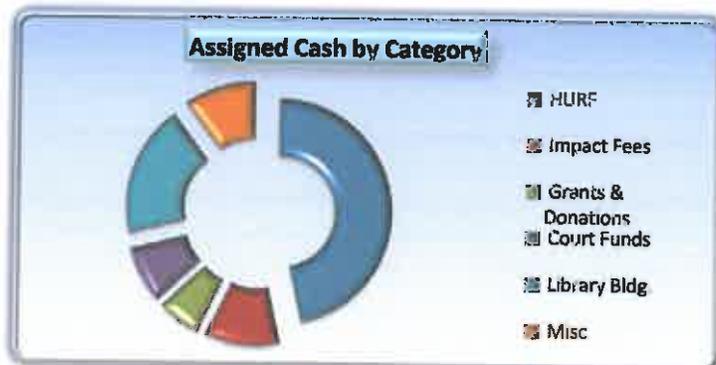

Once again, preliminary General Fund expense numbers have come in under budget for the year. At a 95% of budget, the Town managed to save over \$293,000 from the expected year-end total. As can be seen from the graph above, the annual expenses are very similar to last year's total expenses. The Town continues to maintain a strong financial base through this time of fiscal recovery.

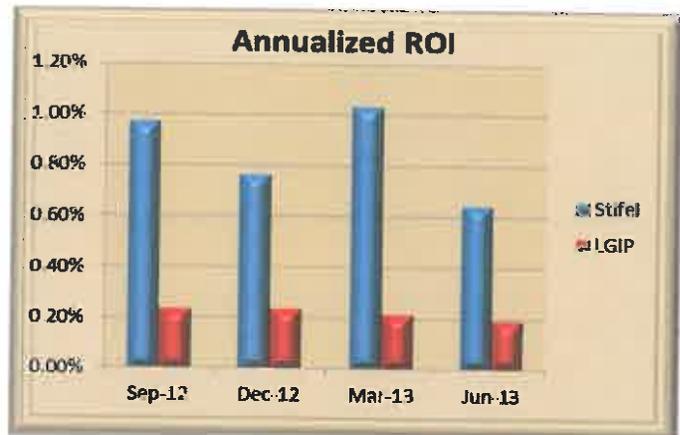

New Officer Clint Jackson started the NART police academy on August 5, 2013

Marshals Office:

- August 6, 2013, CVMO participated in National Night Out. It was a wonderful turnout, the food was prepared by the VIPs along with Deputy Freeman and was a huge hit!
- August 8, 2013, extra enforcement efforts around school zones for first day of school.
- August 26th and 27th CVMO transitioned to all officers carrying department owned Glock handguns. Each officer was trained on the mechanics of the weapon along with a day and night qualification shoot.
- August 30th and 31st CVMO participated in DUI enforcement detail along with Cottonwood, YAPD, Sheriff's Office, DPS, Clarkdale police departments.

GOHS Grant Approval:

- The Governor's Office of Highway Safety granted CVMO with left over grant money in the amount of \$7,500.00 to purchase a computer and fax machine for the command van, 4 portable breath tests for patrol, a phlebotomy chair, and training for a VIP to respond to callouts for blood draws.

Good news from Yavapai County: When the County budget was finalized, Yavapai Free Library District (YFLD) was able to put \$200,000 back into the formula determining each public library's allotment. The new figure puts YFLD's contribution to Camp Verde Community Library at \$86,226.13 which is \$3,577.87 less than the FY2013 budget, NOT \$14,537.19 less as originally projected.



The final step toward demolition of the building at 33 W Moser Lane was taken when Mike Dumas cut off at ground level the light pole between the Library Annex and the Library.

Camp Verde Community Library is the last library in the Yavapai Library Network to apply Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tags to its material. A tagging station was delivered to CVCL from YFLD and volunteers have begun the tagging process, starting in the Large Print Room. By applying RFID tags, we are preparing to use the technology for self-checkout stations in the new library.



CVLE Book Sale sold a total of \$1,782.30 worth of used material at their May – August sales. If you haven't seen their new store located in the Rio Verde Plaza at the corner of Main & Fain, you are missing a treat. The Book sale volunteers, under the inspiration of Laura Gagnon, worked very hard to make the new location attractive and welcoming.

The Library Building Committee, consisting of Joel Westervelt, Linda Harkness, Gerry Laurito and Kathy Hellman, added three very valuable members: Ron Long, Troy

Odell and Deb Ranney. Their experience and expertise in the bidding and construction phase of the project is very much appreciated. I look forward to working with them. The committee determined the timeline to construction as follows:

- mid-end of October: submit plans to the Town and Yavapai County for approval and building permits
- first week of January: open for bids
- the week of January 19: pre-bid meeting
- the week of February 9: open bid packets and award bid
- mid-February to mid-March: go before Town Council for approval
- mid-late March: begin construction

Alice trained 12 new volunteers this summer, 4 of them teens! CVCL's volunteer program has really taken off in the last year and we appreciate all the work that our volunteers do for us. We couldn't provide half the programs and services we offer without our dedicated group of volunteers showing up to work every week. Alice Gottschalk deserves the credit for making the volunteer program successful. She puts a lot of thought and effort into fitting each volunteer to tasks he/she will enjoy. She handles all the scheduling and training. She is the heart of the volunteer program at CVCL and it shows.

CVCL added a subscription to [Tumble Book Library](#) and [Tumble Book Cloud Junior](#) to our website. Any community member can go to the library's website at www.campverde.az.gov/government/library and click on the purple button labeled **KIDS & TEENS**. Then click on **Links for Kids** to access an amazing variety of e-books, videos, puzzles & games, audio books, etc. No login, password or any other hoops to jump through! It's access plain and simple. "TumbleBookLibrary is an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach young children the joys of reading in a format they'll love."

I am personally celebrating because on August 7, I served the last day of my 16 week commitment on the 176th Yavapai County Grand Jury. No more trips to Prescott early Wednesday mornings. I can actually show up to work at the library where I'd much rather be!

Fiscal Year 2013 – 2014; Project/Tasks List with Staff Assignments

In an effort to keep our Council, Town Manager, Town Staff, and the general public updated on the progress of our projects and assigned duties; we in Public Works are introducing a new section to our monthly report that will provide monthly updates and other pertinent information. The following outline is an initial list of the projects and tasks we are working on in Fiscal Year 13 – 14 and the staff assignments. **MONTHLY REPORT FOR AUGUST
BUILDING DIVISION**

Attended the monthly Safety Committee meeting, and conducted the quarterly loss control audit of Town properties. This inspection was conducted at the Community Development Department and Safety committee members conducting the inspection were Denise Alm, Camp Verde library, Laura Miller, Camp Verde Marshal's office, Kristi Gagnon, Camp Verde Fire District, Jan Grogan, Camp Verde Sanitation Department and myself.

Assisted Public works by attending seven (7) interviews with Mike Dumas and Dave Russell from maintenance for the two open positions in that Division. Attended the National Night Out Town function for Community Development. Held meetings with the contractor concerning the repairs on the Chase bank building, and a meeting with staff and the Economic Development Director and potential applicant for a micro-brewery on Main St.

Held a pre-development meeting with staff, Camp Verde Fire Marshal, contractor, real estate agent and potential applicant concerning a possible new auto-body shop located on Finnie Flat Road. Continued working with the Building Division's new Permit Technician/Administrative Assistant Kendall Welch who started work in Community Development on July 15th. Anyone who has not met Kendall please feel free to come by the office and do so.

Attended a meeting with the Building Officials from Yavapai County, Prescott, Prescott Valley, Chino Valley and Dewey-Humboldt in Prescott to discuss the progress and coordination of possible approval of the new 2012 Building Codes by the respective elected officials in those jurisdictions. The goal is to bring this before the Camp Verde Town Council by April of 2014 for consideration and possible approval by the Council. Prepared a tentative schedule of informal meetings of staff with the public and stakeholders beginning in October and running through January of 2014. These will be held on Monday evenings from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. in Council chambers. Excepting the week of October 28th to attend the AZBO Institute and the week of December 23rd for the Christmas Holiday. Have invested considerable time reviewing and considering amendments to the proposed technical codes, to be possibly adopted, to reflect the geographic and climatic environment of Camp Verde.

Conducted the final inspections and approval of the solar project at the Camp Verde School Complex. Held meetings with the owner and engineer concerning a retaining wall constructed without a permit, meetings with the Camp Verde Marshall regarding the new kennel/impound on Industrial Drive. This project should be finished in September. Approved the permit for the

Fed Ex expansion on Cherry road, and had several meetings and site visits with staff, Town Manager and Camp Verde Fire Marshal concerning an industrial nuisance at Boyles Way.

Performed 67 Building Inspections, issued 4 business licenses, 12 miscellaneous site visits, 8 postings for the Clerks' Office, Zoning Division and Building Division. Attended 32 meetings, had 111 phone calls and 19 Plan Reviews.
