The following is a general Manager's report regarding activities in the month of November 2012:

Resolution Relative to Hwy 260

This resolution is being passed by all the communities in the Verde Valley over the next few weeks. This is an opportunity for the Town and other local communities to work together with ADOT to promote the widening of SR 260 for a safer, more efficient travel corridor that mutually benefits all the communities within the Verde Valley.

Volunteer Appreciation 'indoor picnic'

November 7, 2012: held a volunteer appreciation 'indoor picnic' for those participating in the concept, design, and construction of the new steps from the soccer field to the Ramada. I am grateful that volunteers continue to provide for the community and are patient with the progress we continue to make.

Library

Recently, staff met twice with Architect Joel Westervelt. They discussed desires/needs and are developing acceptable solutions to complex problems while simultaneously being good stewards of the available budget. Mike Showers and I met with representatives of three banks in town. As a clearer scope emerges in January, we will bring you financing options with respect to the Library building Mr. Westervelt is designing.

Phone System

On December 4th we switched over to our new phone system which has many new functions. Additionally, the system has a few quirks that we will resolve. The important thing is you can continue to use some of the main lines. The new system will allow:

- 1) You to have direct telephone numbers to staff instead of a number/extension. The system allows for extensions (**all new extensions are 4 digits, the former three digit extensions will not work**);
- 2) It allows for voice recognition of staff member names.
- 3) Bottom line - **the new, easy main number is 554-0000**. Then, you simply say the full name of the person or department you are trying to reach and it will automatically transfer you. Give it a try – it's very convenient. All the departments are connected, no different numbers are necessary for the Library or the Marshal's office. If you do run into issues with the system, please let us know as soon as possible. We will work to fix the matter or help you through the process.

Press Luncheon Idea

I have thought about a way to assist the Town and the numerous non-profits/organizations in getting press coverage and connections among each other regarding activities. I would like to hold a monthly or bi-monthly luncheon with the press. This is an opportunity for the press to get together with the Town, Economic Development and possibly regular attendance by a Department Head or Council member(s) to talk about ongoing positive activities, stories or events occurring in Camp Verde. Any feedback to such an idea is appreciated. I am hoping to schedule the first meeting in January. My plan is to rotate the press luncheons throughout restaurants in Camp Verde. This effort is an attempt to provide opportunities to make positive connections and build stronger relationships among the non-profits/organizations, the Town and the press.

CDBG #100-11 Hollamon Street Improvement Project – The Hollamon Street project is complete and closed-out. Some final payments will be completed during the month of November. The Hollamon Street project is complete and closed out.

ADOH HOME Grant #302-11 – Following a discussion between the Finance Director and the Department of Housing, it was determined that the balance required to be spent is approximately \$100,000. Thus, one applicant will be served with a replacement. The other applicant withdrew from the program. The replacement project should be bid in December.

Retirements:

- November 10, 2012, Sharon Teixeira retired from Dispatch after 23 years of service. A farewell barbeque was hosted by Dispatch supervisor Mary Newton, town employees were invited as well as neighboring dispatchers.

New Hires:

- Bret Hood was hired to fill the position of the Detective Sergeant. Bret was a lateral officer from Sedona police department.
- Autumn Chloe Dintaman was hired to fill the opening in Dispatch. Chloe previously worked as a dispatcher for the forest service. She will attend a dispatch training in December for 2 ½ weeks in Lake Havasu where she will receive her necessary certifications.

Hurricane Sandy:

Lisa Diacik signed up as a volunteer list to respond to Hurricane Sandy "Volunteer Relief for Animal Control" through the National Animal Control Association. She was placed on a standby list to respond, however her assistance was not needed.

Trash pickup along Hwy 260:

Approximately 20 employees from the Marshal's Office along with VIP's and town employees participated in a trash cleanup along Hwy 260 between mile marker 223 and 224 on November 3rd. It was a fabulous turn out and a pot luck barbeque took place afterward at the Marshal's Office.

DUI Task force:

November 9, 2012 - the Marshal's Office participated in a multi-agency task force utilizing VIP's to set up and man the command van for use to process DUI's. Agencies who participated included, Cottonwood, Jerome, DPS, and Yavapai Nation. Camp Verde resulted in 1 arrest for DUI drugs (failure to have ignition interlock device in his vehicle for a prior DUI), 1 arrest for driving on a suspended license, 14 warnings were given out, 2 citations issued.

Training for the month of November:

- Marshal Gardner, Commander Ganis, Sergeant Hood, Dispatch Supervisor Mary Newton and Reserve Officer Gary Newton attended training pertaining to conducting internal investigations at Peoria police department.
- Cailin Lizotte attended Arizona LERMA Conference.
- VIPs reviewed the parking citation process and how to complete traffic citations.

Capital improvement projects for next 5 years:

In an attempt to have a vision for the future needs of CVMO the listed items were discussed with the Council members:

- Current location of the animal impound moved to the Industrial Park.
- Possible use of the Teen Center as a dispatch center – and expanding the property and evidence room using the current dispatch center area.
- Purchase of new patrol vehicles using a lease purchase process to replace miled out vehicles.
- Looking for storage space for records retention.

Miscellaneous tasks/assignments:

- Darby Martin continued to work with Four D on phone issues with the new system.
- While continuing to obtain motor cycle quotes for various motor cycles, it was learned that Prescott Police Department has 2 Harley motor cycles that they do not use. CVMO is working with PV PD to purchase the used motor cycles verses buying a new motor cycle.
- Marshal Gardner met with Council member Bruce George regarding refurbishing unclaimed bicycles. Bruce is interested in refurbishing the bikes and work with CVMO to donate them to needy children in the community. This project is in the research / planning stages.

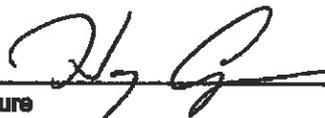

CAMP VERDE COMMUNITY LIBRARY MONTHLY REPORT

At the beginning of November, I attended the Arizona Library Association (AzLA) conference in Phoenix. One emphasis for AZ Libraries and libraries nationwide is to find an inexpensive solution to provide access to popular ebook titles to library patrons. Currently, libraries pay 3-4 times more for new ebooks than the same title costs in print or as an Amazon ebook. The Yavapai Library Network is partnering with libraries across Arizona on a task force that will join libraries nationwide in addressing this issue at the American Library Association conference in January.

To increase and standardize staff proficiency levels in helping patrons from the circulation desk or on the Internet computers, we have each scheduled ourselves to work the public service desk for 2-hour slots multiple times each week. Library staff members have been doing this since the end of September with good results. By staffing a “public service desk” where patrons can get immediate help we improve our service to the public at point of contact and we give each other less-interrupted time in our offices to accomplish other tasks. This has allowed us to make good progress in weeding outdated material, planning new directions for library programming, selecting new material, and getting involved again in teaching patrons to use library resources.

Speaking of weeding library material: CVCL has donated a few duplicate titles or titles that our patrons do not checkout to Camp Verde High School Library. This allows us to keep the items in the system (since CVUSD is a member of the YLN) so our patrons can still access them if they need to, and gives the high school students better access to the material.

Architect, Joel Westervelt delivered preliminary drawings to the library staff for review and comment. The Library Planning Committee decided to pursue the feasibility of using a steel building to build a 2-story building during the first phase which would add an estimated and much needed 7,000 square feet to the first phase. While library staff reviewed and made suggestions for layout changes to the floor plan, Joel researched the steel building concept and reported back that is a concept worth pursuing.

We are exploring the possibility of refurbishing some library furnishings for the new library instead of purchasing all new equipment/furniture. It is not only a cost-saving measure, it is an effort to act responsibly in what we choose to discard and/or keep and think about how it impacts our environment as well as our pocketbooks. I also, personally like the idea of the continuity of time and respect for history expressed by mixing the old with the new. I have been talking with a representative of Arizona Correctional Industries and will be getting more detailed information

about how they may be able to serve our needs. I also welcome local businesses to stop by and talk to us about what we are thinking along these lines.

Activity in the Children's Library is picking ups as Peggy is back in the swing of things after having the summer off. New programs, such as Dance Play for Children and Saturday Story and Craft Time are becoming increasingly popular. At the end of November, we welcomed Nancy McClay our new part-time temporary Library Clerk to the Children's Library. Nancy was volunteering at CVCL while working on an on-call basis for the Sedona Children's Library. She agreed to come and help us out in our Children's Library and has already begun to have a positive impact. Due to her prior experience in a YLN Library, she jumped right in with little training required.

Gerry finished up a 6-week series of beginning adult computer classes with great reviews from participating patrons. He taught the hands-on series at the library's public Internet computers making them unavailable for use on Fridays between 8:30 am and 1 pm. A new series of computer use classes will begin in mid-January. In the meantime, public Internet computers are open to the public on Fridays.

Alice and Katy are exploring ways to involve more 12-17 year olds in CVCL services. They made personal visits to several local charter schools and have plans to go onsite to register students for library cards. Katy is collaborating with the Cottonwood Teen Librarian to determine the best way to start a teen advocacy board that may have the opportunity to make a difference in teen library services for the next few generations of Camp Verde teens as we provide a space in the new library just for teens.

We are still making a few physical changes here at the library. By the time we are done, we will have moved every single book in the library getting all of them up off the floor and making room for re-shelving returned items. I have also begun cleaning out the library's storage room at the old Marshall's office. The purpose for this is threefold: to inventory and consolidate our supplies, to make the room safe for staff/volunteers to enter and to prepare for the eventual demolition of the building.

I have been purchasing new books for the adult department from COSTCO once a month. This saves the library a lot of money in shipping and handling fees and gets new material on the shelf faster.

It has been a real treat to Library staff to get back to attending Yavapai Library Network committee meetings as well as taking part in a variety of other professional development opportunities. This is made possible by the fact that we are presently in good shape with the number and quality of people on staff. The chance to interact with peers and hear information firsthand boosts morale and keeps us enthusiastic about our service to the Camp Verde community. We appreciate all the support we have gotten from our community to help with our efforts at the library.

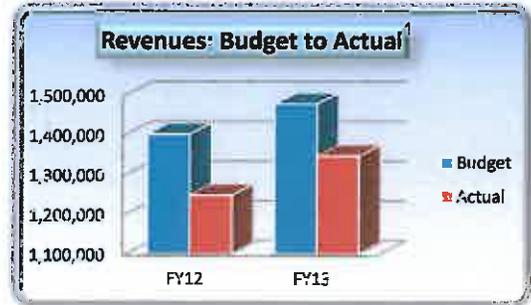

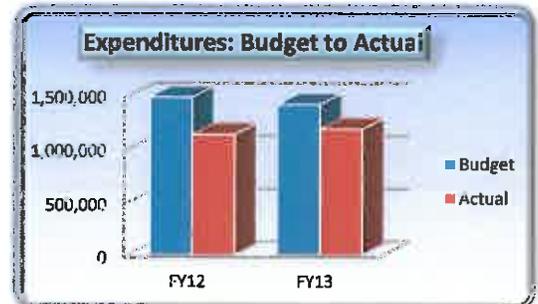

Local taxes started a bit slow in the 1st quarter, down nearly \$70,000 from budgeted expectations and Court Fines, though a much smaller revenue line, are nearly 10% off of budget. Much of the city tax shortage is due to misfilings by local businesses which will be corrected over time. We did see a strong rebound in October with local taxes coming in \$20,000 over budget for the month. State sales tax is also just a bit below budget for the quarter but not enough to warrant concern. At this point, we are watching revenues as they come in to gage the direction of tax revenues over this next quarter.
