

**1. Call to Order**

Chairman Davis called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm

**2. Roll Call**

Chairman Davis, Vice Chairman Freeman, Commissioners Blue, Burnside, Norton and Parrish.

Absent: Commissioner Hisrich.

Also Present: Community Development Director Mike Jenkins, Assistant Planner Kendall Welch and Recording Secretary Marie Moore.

Vice Chairman Freeman led the pledge.

**On a motion by Norton seconded by Blue Commission unanimously passed the consent agenda. Vice Chairman Freeman abstained from voting.**

**5. Update, Clarification and Discussion on Town Council's Direction to Staff concerning the "Water Demand and Conservation Assessment for the Town of Camp Verde – April 2014" as prepared by Western Resource Advocates (Linda Stitzer) and the incorporation of a Town-Sponsored Water Conservation Policy into the General Plan Update. – Staff Resource: Community Development Director, Michael Jenkins**

Community Development Director, Michael Jenkins addressed commission regarding the actual meaning of the recommendation made by Linda Stitzer to Council on implementation strategies for a Town Sponsored water conservation policy. There were three strategies provided to the Council as follows:

1. Focus on education – Stitzer meant focus on education to reduce large outdoor use.
2. Codes & Ordinances – adopt codes and ordinances.
3. Marketing – Develop community wide awareness.

Jenkins indicated that this is a general direction to staff with clarification coming from Stitzer.

Chairman Davis indicated his concern that there isn't enough information for Commission to move forward with.

Jenkins stated that he interpreted Council's request for Commission to move forward with all the information received from Western Resource Advocates and provide goals and implementations strategies in the Water Resources Element of the General Plan that encourage and promote a Town Sponsored Water Conservation Policy which could be used in the future in creating the said policy.

Chairman Davis stated that he felt the Commission was already following the information with in the study provided toward the General Plan with identification as to where the information was received from.

Commissioner Burnside indicated that in 2008 staff provided as much information as available and at that time Commission requested better direction from Council regarding what was needed. Burnside believed that was the genesis of the study completed by Western Resource Advocates. Burnside indicated he felt that staff was not providing enough information for Commission to use in order to create any Code or Ordinance.

Chairman Davis recommended setting a date for acceptance to move forward with the water policy item.

**6. Discussion, Public Input, and Commission Consensus on Chapter 11 - Water Resources.** Continued from the August 13, 2015 General Plan Work Session meeting.

It is the consensus of the Commission to make the following changes:

Page 1: Remove the first sentence "Tony Gioia to provide ...."

Page 2: Last paragraph under Existing and future supplies and demand shall read "...for the Town of Camp Verde that was **supported** by Town Council..."

Page 6: Linda Stitzer is directed to provide Commission with resource information regarding the white graphic page, upon receiving that information, Commission agrees to include both charts and remove the distribution law statement.

Page 9: Goal A shall read **Preserve and enhance the Town's unique water resources, including the Verde River, creeks, associated riparian areas, ground water, and irrigation ditches.**

Commission approves Goal A implementation strategies.

Goal B: Implementation strategy B2 shall read **Create a drainage system to regulate water runoff to the washes, retention basins, ditches and rivers.**

Implementation strategy B3 shall read **Create guidelines to incorporate Low Impact Development (LID) features to manage storm water, including new or reconstructed roadways, to improve water quality in rivers and washes through the capture and infiltration of runoff.**

Goal C: Implementation strategy C1 shall read **Develop a community-wide water conservation plan, including an awareness plan and implement Town sponsored**

***educational programs and events promoting water conservation.***

Implementation strategy C2 is stricken in its entirety.

Implementation strategy C3 shall read ***Encourage xeriscaping practices in public areas, rights-of-way and in new commercial and residential development, including limiting high water use plants.***

Implementation Strategy C4 shall read ***Encourage water efficient irrigation in new and existing landscaping.***

Implementation strategy C5 shall read ***Investigate adopting an EPA Water Sense program for high-efficiency plumbing for new development.***

Implementation strategy C6 shall read ***Encourage new residential and commercial development to incorporate LID design, including storm water capture features.***

Implementation strategy C7 shall read ***Reduce large outdoor residential irrigation use through education, improved efficiency and management in partnership with ditch companies, cooperative extension and others.***

Implementation Strategy C9 shall read ***Evaluate implementation of an ordinance to reduce water waste.***

Implementation strategy C10 shall read ***Encourage the recharge of reclaimed water.***

Implementation strategy C11 shall read ***Create programs including education and incentives to use reclaimed water, treated effluent, harvested rainwater and gray water on open spaces, parks, playing fields and private use, thereby, conserving ground water.***

Implementation strategy C12 is stricken in its entirety.

The Planning and Zoning Commission provided consensus to the Water Resources Element.

**7. Discussion, Public Input, and Commission Consensus on Chapter 7 – Housing.**

Continued from the July 9, 2015 General Plan Work Session meeting.

It is the consensus of the Commission to create a 2014 population charge for comparison purposes. Commission directs staff to create a chart using 2014 data received from Yavapai College data. Staff is to modify the 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph on page 2 to fit 2015 and place it after the 2014 assessment and Housing Stock with a title similar to the 2010 chart.

Page 4: Commissioner Norton is to include non-subsidized numbers and confirm the number of subsidized. The term “residential” shall be included before “rental properties” for clarification as well.

8. **Discussion of Attendance at the next General Plan Work Session, scheduled for Thursday, September 10, 2015.**

All commission members indicated they would be present at the meeting on September 10, 2015.

**5. Discussion, Public Input, and Commission Consensus on Chapter 7 - Housing.**

Continued from the August 27, 2015 General Plan Work Session meeting.

Commissioner Norton indicated that he had several failed attempts in locating the information requested by Commission and was referred to the County. Asst. Planner Kendall Welch is currently in the process of obtaining any information available.

After reviewing the data submitted by Tom Pitts, it is the consensus of the Commission to review the information received from the County and Pitts at the next General Plan Meeting.

**6. Discussion, Public Input, and Commission Consensus on Chapter 8 – Transportation and Circulation.**

It is the consensus of the Commission that Chapter 8 shall read as follows:

**Vision Statement:**

A variety of circulation, trails and transportation systems will be provided within the Town of Camp Verde. These systems will be designed, constructed and maintained in conjunction with the Land Use Element plan in a manner that will provide convenient and safe travel.

**Introduction:**

This element consists of the general location and extent of existing and proposed freeways, arterial and collector streets, bicycle routes, trails and any other modes of transportation as may

be appropriate, all correlated with the Land Use Element plan.

The following is an assessment of the current trails and roadways, along with a listing of proposed improvements as of 2015.

Several new road projects are scheduled to be completed in the next few years. State Route 260 will be improved to a four-lane highway from Wilshire Road to Thousand Trails Road. A round-a-bout will be constructed at the intersection of State Route 260 and Industrial Drive/Goswick Way. The third and final phase of the Townsite Street Improvement Project will repave Arnold, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> streets and Arnold Terrace. Engineered plans will be prepared for the future construction of Finnie Flat Road and the tri-intersection of Main Street, Montezuma Castle Highway and Finnie Flat Road. The Finnie Flat Sidewalk Improvement Project is also scheduled to include improvements to match the Main Street Improvements constructed in 2004-2005.

There are a limited number of designated bike paths in the Town. There are plans to extend these along State Route 260 with its improvements. The Town envisions interconnecting neighborhoods and businesses with bike paths.

**Circulation Map:**

No changes will be made to this section.

**Trails Map:**

An attraction for the Town is its extensive trails system. (The remainder of the paragraph remains as written.)

Tony Gioia volunteered to verify the Trails Map with the help of other Sub-committee members and return it to the Commission for further review.

**Goal A: Promote the design of multi-modal systems to improve public safety and access while preserving our rural lifestyle.**

**Implementation Strategies – Roads:**

A1 – Maintain the character of Main Street in order to protect the rural and historic nature of the downtown area including Fort Verde State Historic Park.

A2 – Encourage road proposals that protect view sheds.

A3 – Encourage streetscape guidelines to separate non-motorized paths from roadways.

A4 – Promote the identification of historically significant ranch roads as part of the Town's circulation system.

A5 – Improve natural drainage alongside roadways when improvement projects are undertaken.

A6 – Provide for bike paths and lanes within road easements linking neighborhoods and commercial areas, where feasible, when road widening and resurfacing projects are considered.

**Implementation Strategies – Trails:**

A7 - Encourage cooperation to retain and establish low maintenance trails with public and private entities.

A8 – Adopt standards within Town ordinances, including recommendations to ensure inclusion of trails within new development.

A9 – Investigate potentially creating a trail map for the Town of Camp Verde which would identify existing trails and paths with trailhead signage and provide amenities where possible.

Goal B: Provide access to link parks and neighborhoods, providing for ease of movement and safety for multi-modal transportation.

Implementation Strategies – Roads:

B1 – Promote a convenient and handicapped accessible public transit system to link the Town site, tourist attractions, commercial areas, schools, neighborhoods, parks, trails systems and neighboring towns.

B2 – Promote bike paths and lanes within road rights-of-way linking neighborhoods and commercial areas, during road widening and resurfacing projects.

Implementation Strategies – Trails:

B3 – Utilize the Trails Map to provide information about recreation opportunities.

B4 – Encourage easements from the U.S. Forest Service, County, State and property owners to enhance trail systems.

B5 – Identify and develop walkways and trails that link neighborhoods and preserve a “sense of community”.

Goal C: Moved to Implementation Strategy 1 for Goal A.

Goal D: Coordinate with property owners, Town officials and appropriate agencies to improve transportation corridors within designated growth areas.

Implementation Strategies:

D1 - Coordinate with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT), property owners and others to provide comprehensive transportation/access plan adjacent to State Route 260.

D2 – Promote adequate access to commercial and mixed use development within growth areas.

Goal E is stricken in its entirety.

**VISION STATEMENT**

Camp Verde will remain a community that enjoys a high value of environmental quality. The Town will consider effects of new developments on the environment and promote practices that create and maintain a healthy, safe, and enjoyable living environment.

**STATE REQUIREMENTS**

The Environmental Planning Element of the Town of Camp Verde's General Plan is mandated by Arizona Revised Statutes, which stipulates that communities larger than 2,500 inhabitants include an Environmental Planning Element.

According to Arizona statutes, the Environmental Planning Element will include "analysis, policies and strategies that are designed to address anticipated effects, if any, of plan elements on air quality, water quality and natural resources associated with proposed development under the General Plan.

"The policies and strategies to be developed under this element shall be designed to have community-wide applicability and shall not require the production of an additional environmental impact statement or similar analysis beyond the requirements of state and federal law."
