The Library participated in the July 4th Parade down Main Street. We used the opportunity to make contact with local teens and invite them to learn more about the Teen Advisory Board (TAB) application process. Molli distributed posters and information throughout Camp Verde about the upcoming TAB selection process. Inquiries and interest have increased throughout the month and some applications have already been submitted.



Yavapai Free Library District (YFLD) announced a cut in funds going out to public libraries due to a decision by the Yavapai County Supervisors that cut \$600,000 out of YFLD's FY2014 budget. CVCL will receive \$14,537 less in FY14 than in FY13 from YFLD funds.

Kathy Hellman and Steve and Alex Goetting had a phone interview with Tracy Lea and Jim Cook of [Skysong](#) to explore the possibility of CVCL having an [Alexandria Network](#) location in the new library. The Alexandria Network comes from [ASU's Venture Catalyst](#) department and provides connections and support for entrepreneurial efforts through public libraries. CVCL and the CV Chamber of Commerce are considering a collaborative effort as we learn more about the Alexandria Network at a September 20 training event in Scottsdale.

Gerry Laurito, volunteer Ann Rasor and Kathy Hellman were taught the basics of original cataloging by Megan Hammond, YFLD. Many new items added to CVCL's shelves already have bibliographic records in the Yavapai Library Network's system. However, original bibliographic records must be created for local authors', musicians' and filmmakers' work. This training will allow us to better meet our goal of collecting works by local artists.

Damage Control, LLC out of Mesa began asbestos abatement on the Library Annex building at 33 W Moser Lane on July 25. The job took longer than predicted because a second ceiling with “popcorn” finished tiles was discovered several feet above the visible ceiling. Damage Control removed all the infected material and the building passed inspection on July 31. It has been covered with graffiti as a fundraiser for CCCVL and will be used for SWAT training exercises before demolition begins September 12.

CVCL collaborated with CV Parks and Recreation in a Teen Pool Party event at the Town pool. Teens were admitted at no charge when they filled out a short survey about the TAB and other town events aimed at teens. Food was provided by the library and lifeguards were provided by Parks & Recreation. Teens who came had a blast! The Library and Parks & Recreation are discussing more collaborative efforts in upcoming months.

CVCL’s Children’s Summer Reading Program (SRP) concluded on July 30 with a grand finale performance by Sticks and Tones. Thanks are again due Mike Marshall and CV Parks & Recreation for facilitating the Children’s Library’s use of the Town Gym. The Teen SRP ended August 1 with an Ice Cream Sundae Social at the library. Prizes for the Teen Awards drawing went to:

Good news from Yavapai County: When the County budget was finalized, Yavapai Free Library District (YFLD) was able to put \$200,000 back into the formula determining each public library's allotment. The new figure puts YFLD's contribution to Camp Verde Community Library at \$86,226.13 which is \$3,577.87 less than the FY2013 budget, NOT \$14,537.19 less as originally projected.



The final step toward demolition of the building at 33 W Moser Lane was taken when Mike Dumas cut off at ground level the light pole between the Library Annex and the Library.

Camp Verde Community Library is the last library in the Yavapai Library Network to apply Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tags to its material. A tagging station was delivered to CVCL from YFLD and volunteers have begun the tagging process, starting in the Large Print Room. By applying RFID tags, we are preparing to use the technology for self-checkout stations in the new library.



CVLE Book Sale sold a total of \$1,782.30 worth of used material at their May – August sales. If you haven't seen their new store located in the Rio Verde Plaza at the corner of Main & Fain, you are missing a treat. The Book sale volunteers, under the inspiration of Laura Gagnon, worked very hard to make the new location attractive and welcoming.

The Library Building Committee, consisting of Joel Westervelt, Linda Harkness, Gerry Laurito and Kathy Hellman, added three very valuable members: Ron Long, Troy

Odell and Deb Ranney. Their experience and expertise in the bidding and construction phase of the project is very much appreciated. I look forward to working with them. The committee determined the timeline to construction as follows:

- mid-end of October: submit plans to the Town and Yavapai County for approval and building permits
- first week of January: open for bids
- the week of January 19: pre-bid meeting
- the week of February 9: open bid packets and award bid
- mid-February to mid-March: go before Town Council for approval
- mid-late March: begin construction

Alice trained 12 new volunteers this summer, 4 of them teens! CVCL's volunteer program has really taken off in the last year and we appreciate all the work that our volunteers do for us. We couldn't provide half the programs and services we offer without our dedicated group of volunteers showing up to work every week. Alice Gottschalk deserves the credit for making the volunteer program successful. She puts a lot of thought and effort into fitting each volunteer to tasks he/she will enjoy. She handles all the scheduling and training. She is the heart of the volunteer program at CVCL and it shows.

CVCL added a subscription to [Tumble Book Library](#) and [Tumble Book Cloud Junior](#) to our website. Any community member can go to the library's website at www.campverde.az.gov/government/library and click on the purple button labeled **KIDS & TEENS**. Then click on **Links for Kids** to access an amazing variety of e-books, videos, puzzles & games, audio books, etc. No login, password or any other hoops to jump through! It's access plain and simple. "TumbleBookLibrary is an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach young children the joys of reading in a format they'll love."

I am personally celebrating because on August 7, I served the last day of my 16 week commitment on the 176th Yavapai County Grand Jury. No more trips to Prescott early Wednesday mornings. I can actually show up to work at the library where I'd much rather be!

The Raising a Reader program, brought to CVCL by Yavapai College in partnership with First Things First circulated an additional - 161 children's books this month.

Camp Verde Community Library has an opening for a Youth Services Librarian. We are seeking qualified applicants to fill the position.

Thanks to our wonderful volunteer, Nancy Raistrick, 90 damaged library items were repaired and put back into circulation. Nancy volunteers nearly every day the library is open and helps us at the Circulation desk, painstakingly mends items week after week and helps cover/process new books for Technical Services. She is

one example of the quality and caliber of volunteers Camp Verde Community Library has the privilege of working with.

Library Director, Kathy Hellman, attended an informational workshop about the [Alexandria Network](#) at [ASU Skysong](#). We are exploring how CVCL can partner with ASU to bring opportunity to Camp Verde businesses and entrepreneurs.



They held their first official meeting with breakfast at Denny’s where they decided to participate in Trick or Treat on Main at the end of the month. We are so proud of Molli and our wonderful teens (and are especially fond of those who volunteer for us nearly every Saturday morning and helping with RFID tagging)!



The second biggest news was our involvement in the Fort Verde Days Creator Faire. There were 287 surveys returned and a door count of about 1500 visitors for our weekend event. Surveys returned showed the following results:

Some may wonder why the library would choose to be involved in an event like the Creator Faire. From inception, our goal has been to demonstrate to the community that Camp Verde Community Library is not a passive organization waiting around for people to come to us. Rather, the library is looking for opportunities to be proactive in participating in community events in ways that support civic engagement and expand cooperative learning and economic opportunities. The Creator Faire was our first attempt to play a role in a key community event like the Fort Verde Days festival. Of course, we made some mistakes, but we learned a lot about what worked and didn't work and we will make improvements when we do it again in 2015.

The Yavapai Library Network will roll out a new version of the online catalog in late December. We will be upgrading from eLibrary to Enterprise, a system that provides a better user experience through enhancements like search suggestions, faceted searching, book reviews and read-a-likes. Patrons' information will seamlessly move from eLibrary to Enterprise so that there will be no disruption of services to library users. If all goes as planned, the biggest change customers will notice is vastly improved search results.

We continue to grow and serve through monthly programs in and beyond the library. Programs such as, Using the Online Catalog for Camp Verde Home Educators, Story Time at Day Care Facilities in the area, Brown Bag Lunch programs, library services at Verde View Apartments, Dance Play, Raising a Reader, Baby Brain Time, etc.

The library partnered with Camp Verde Parks & Recreation again this month for Free Movie Night. We buy the DVD, they show it and then it is available for checkout at the library afterward. TAB members gave away popcorn and sold candy and drinks to raise money for future projects. By special request from TAB members, library volunteer, Von Hatch, wowed the audiences with a dramatic reading of Edgar Allen Poe's *The Raven* during intermission. Next FREE movie night is 11/15. Call the library or Parks & Rec to find out what movies will be showing.

To end this busy month, the Children's Library hosted a costume parade (complete with treats) and staff highlighted our Mango language learning software with a Dress/Talk like a Pirate Day on 10/31. CVCL TAB did an awesome job decorating the gazebo on





Main Street and handing out treats to goblins, heroes, princesses and zombies. Then, they showed up with friends to help us clean up. We have some wonderful teens in this community!

We are pleased to have Helen Howard join us as a Library Clerk in Adult Services at the library. Helen comes to us through the Northern Arizona Council of Government's (NACOG) Senior Community Service Employment Program. She will be filling our daily afternoon/evening closing slots ensuring that there are always 2 or more staff people available when the library closes. This will allow all of us to keep more regular hours instead of constantly shifting schedules when one or more staff persons are out.



Library teens promoted Happy Teens-Giving, an effort to thank veterans for their service to our country. Supplies were set out and families took the time to stop and create Thank You cards that were distributed to veterans at the VA Hospital in Prescott during the Thanksgiving holiday.

Fourteen library staff and volunteers participated in the All-Hands training on November 21. Everyone especially appreciated the lunch served by Town Council members and the opportunity to interact with coworkers from other Town departments.

Part-time Library Clerk, Nancy McClay has done an amazing job providing library services, story times, and other activities to Camp Verde children while we search for a new Youth Services Librarian. [Raising a Reader](#) is one of those services. Since its launch in August, 22 families have participated in the Raising a Reader program and 657 children's books have circulated through the hands of participating families.

Tracy Lea, of the ASU Entrepreneurship & Innovation Group visited Camp Verde presenting information about the [Alexandria Co-Working Network](#). ASU is partnering with libraries throughout AZ to bring assets into communities that support economic development & education. Look for an opportunity to join a team of people and visit Scottsdale's Eureka loft to learn more about how the Alexandria Co-Working Network can positively impact our community.

The Yavapai Library Network new [online catalog](#), Enterprise, is available now. Users will enjoy features such as fuzzy searching results ranked by relevance, reading level filters, fiction/nonfiction filters and read-alike recommendation from Novelist. Additionally, searches may be saved and re-executed and lists maintained and emailed or texted to users. The go-live date for Enterprise is Sunday, December 19, 2013. Sunday was chosen for the least impact on users, however, we may experience some downtime or other glitches during the transition.

The lovely ladies (and not a few fetching lads) of CVLE continue to work all hours and all types of tasks to raise money for the library's endowment fund. They put in more hours and effort than some of us work on a weekly basis and are incredibly cheerful and committed. As of 10/3/2013 the CVLE fund invested with the Arizona Community Foundation totaled \$327,686.29 and rising.

The library received a letter from State Librarian, Joan Clark, announcing approval for a State Grants-in-Aid grant in the amount of \$37,000 for library construction.

We were sad to hear that Molli Bryant had to leave our team and move to Morenci AZ. We were suddenly left with a gaping hole that our Teen Advisory Board Manager had filled. Thankfully, Sebra Choe agreed to step in and fill the gap. She met with the TAB teens at the end of December and began right away motivating them to action on the project. Sebra is awesome and we are so glad she agreed to work with us!

At the beginning of the month, TAB Teens started promoting collection points for non-perishable food items to donate to a local food bank. Two teens, Billy Cook and Ethan Moll, have vowed to shave their heads if the community donates 300 or more food items by January 17, 2014. Anyone with extra non-perishable food items is encouraged to help us meet our quota!

In addition to planning and implementing the upcoming Summer Reading Program, Dianna will focus on weeding out old, unused materials and bringing in new up-to-date material and technology during her first year with us. We are fortunate to have Dianna on our team and invite anyone who has a moment to stop by the library and meet her personally.

Library Staff agreed to adopt two families for Christmas this year in lieu of exchanging gifts amongst ourselves. Every staff member selected one or more family members to buy outfits and toys for and then pitched in extra \$\$ for a Basha's gift card for each family. I appreciate being part of a group of people who gives generously to others and maintains a spirit of gratitude for the good that exists in their own lives.

CVLE was open for two book sales in December and netted about \$800. At the end of December, the value of the ACF fund was \$353,449.

Yavapai County completed the initial review of the library plans and returned them to the Town of Camp Verde Building Department for review. Architect, Joel Westervelt and crew are responding to the comments and have been busy moving forward with LEED evaluations on the project. The time to open the project for bids is getting closer!

Near the end of January, we began a series of eReader Learning Labs to interact with patrons who want to learn how to enjoy library ebooks using a variety of eReaders. The eReaders and tablets the library owns came from the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records, a division of the Arizona Secretary of State. We currently have an iPad 2, a Kindle Fire, a Nook Color, a Samsung Galaxy 2, a nook Simple Touch and a Kindle Paperwhite available to checkout on a Camp Verde Community Library account in good standing. We will continue offering eReader Learning Labs as well as one-on-one assistance by appointment any time that we are open.

Teen Advisory Board teens took their first trip to a local library's teen space to begin to get a vision for a teen library in the new Camp Verde Community Library. The group has been busy every Saturday at the library laying the foundation of vision/mission, by-laws, code of conduct, etc. for present and future TAB members.



Dianna Manasse is settling in as Youth Services Librarian working closely with YS Staff Nancy McClay, Denise Alm and Sebra Choe in offering children's programs, supporting TAB efforts, renewing the youth collections (which requires careful inventory and extensive weeding first), learning our library's circulation system, getting up-to-speed on the upcoming Summer Reading focus and more!

CVCL received over 2,100 donated items this fiscal year. Items are reviewed by library staff who decide whether to add them to the library's collection. Out of the 2100 items, 118 were kept at the library. That means that CVLE volunteers received, reviewed and processed over 2,000 items for the used book sale in donations brought to the library. Since donated items must be transported from the library to the CVLE Book Sale, we only take small donations (what one person can carry in two hands) at the library. In that same time period CVLE received multiple large donations at the store. Mega-kudos to Laura Gagnon and faithful crew for all the work they do to make the book sales successful every month..

Under the leadership of Teen Programs Librarian, Sebra Choe, the group has defined its mission and chosen an identity for itself.



...to offer fun, constructive opportunities for teens by creating the best possible programs, activities, and resources through the Camp Verde Community Library.

TAB voted to call itself SLOTH – Service League of Teen Helpers and TAB volunteer, Janine Bearheels designed & created a 3D sloth for their bulletin board in the Youth Library. Library Director, Kathy Hellman attended the Yavapai County Community Foundation Grant workshop in preparation for applying for another grant or two. The focus of these grants will be on furnishings and shelving needed for the interior of the children's and teen spaces.

We celebrated Kite Flying Day, 02/08 and National Chocolate Mint Day on 02/19. Kids and their parents expressed appreciation for a Saturday program that encouraged them to go outside and play. We took advantage of Rezzonico Park next door to the library, thinking ahead to the time when it will be a space we can incorporate seamlessly into children's library activities.

Outreach programs to Verde View Senior Apartments and Rays of Sunshine preschool are increasing in popularity. This month Gerry and Alice took the Library Wii, purchased with a generous donation from Mr. & Mrs. Kleinfeld, to the senior apartments for a bowling demonstration and participation. Alice also places holds for residents, issues library cards and takes Large Print books for checkout to people in the apartments. Throughout the school year, Nancy has been reading to preschoolers and taking picture books from the library for the kids to use.



Looking at the Library Statistics provided with this report it is clear that people are using the Camp Verde Community Library for services other than checking out books (although that happens too). Public computer use is up 33% for the fiscal year, check out of DVDs is up 43% and number/types of programs and attendance is up across the board. Activities like library programs and PC use require more staff time than the usual checkin/checkout activities. We have excellent people working at the library who show patience, kindness and enthusiasm toward meeting patrons' library service needs each week. It's Alice, Dee, Denise, Dianna, Gerry, Nancy, Sebra and Valerie who make the library motto – Good company always welcome – a reality.

CVCL processed 473 donated items for CVLE through the library. Thirty-four items were added to the library's collection and 12 listed for sale on Amazon (thanks to faithful volunteer, Jean McConnell). CVLE volunteers (another faithful and fun-loving group) made nearly \$800.00 in sales at the used book sale this month.

We started the month with a TAB Open House, inviting parents of existing and potential members to get to know the teens and adults on the team. Dianna & Sebra are building relationships with our TAB teens, making a lasting impact in their lives at a very crucial time. We are happy to see progress and thankful for the teens who are committing volunteering their time to work with us.

TAB has agreed to sponsor weekly Thursday Game Nights in the Children’s Library. Thanks to our Town Maintenance we now have a retractable screen mounted on the wall to make it easier to setup for gaming. TAB also just started their own blog for teens. The Library Planning Committee convened for a mandatory pre-bid meeting on March 26. The Council Chambers were full with standing room only. Bid submittal closes April 22, 2014 and we expect to bring our recommendation to Council on May 7.



Dianna provided a variety of tech toys for kids to learn about and enjoy during Spring Break, March 10-15, which also happened to be Teen Tech Week. Even though the idea is to focus on teens, our teens are very gracious about sharing and interacting with younger kids. If you wonder why the library involves itself in games and technology, it’s all part of encouraging literacy. When children



experience reading as part of a pleasure/reward activity, they are more likely to continue reading, opening doors to unlimited potential.

One of the highlights of March was being invited to participate in the SciTech Festival at Camp Verde High School. Dianna brought the tech toys and the Chris Guerra, from Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records, a Division of the Secretary of State brought a 3D printer. Sphero, the robot ball, was a hit, as was the 3D printer! We interacted with hundreds of kids from elementary through high school and were especially happy to see several of our home-school families (we say, "our" because they are regular library users and we are proud to support them). Librarians also promoted our upcoming summer reading program to the students.



Gerry and Alice continued outreach programs to adults. They played Wii golf with 8 residents at Verde Valley Senior Apartments and introduced teachers at the Camp Verde Adult Reading Center to the joys of downloading e-books on Kindle e-readers. Both these programs are ongoing efforts to take library services beyond the four walls of the library and to invite people to use library services and resources.

Camp Verde Community Library was proud to be part of the successful Spring Heritage Festival. Library Director, Kathy Hellman, attended committee meetings and lent support where possible. The library sponsored an event information booth where many visitors stopped for maps, directions and a warm welcome. Many people also stopped to complement us on the quality of the event as they were leaving.

CVCL processed 815 donated items for CVLE through the library. Forty items were added to the library's collection and 1 listed for sale on Amazon (thanks to faithful volunteer, Jean McConnell). CVLE volunteers (another faithful and fun-loving group) held 2 sales this month totaling over \$960.00 in used book sales. CVLE & CCCVL co-sponsored a "Stay-at-Home" tea party in honor of Dorothy Wood collecting over \$4,500.00 in donations by the end of March.

The library was notified of approval for funding two Library Services & Technology Act (LSTA) grant applications. This funding is made possible by the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records, a division of the Arizona Secretary of State, under the Library Services and Technology Act, which is administered by the Institute of Museum and Library Services. One grant, in the amount of \$35,000 will provide another year of partial funding for the Teen Advisory Board Manager as well as an opening day collection for the teen space in the new library. The other grant, in the amount of \$10,700 will be used to design and create a new state-of-the-art library website that works on mobile devices and provides better access to library resources.

Bids on the Library Construction project, Bid #14-107 were opened and recorded on Wednesday, April 23. We received 7 bids ranging from \$3,111,000 to \$4,149,000. Next step - Town Council input and direction.



During National Volunteer week, we celebrated our wonderful volunteers with an outing to Johnny Rockets. Library Specialist, Alice Gottschalk, put together a fantastic luncheon and treats to show appreciation for the many hours of work given by volunteers. From April 2013 – April 2014, library volunteers worked 4,623 hours for the library! We couldn't keep up without them and are so grateful for each one.

CVCL received 776 donated items at the library in April. Sixty-five of those items were added to our collection and seven were listed on Amazon for sale. The remainder

were taken to CVLE's used book sale at Rio Verde Plaza. CVLE's fund with the Arizona Community Foundation has reached over 75% of the endowment's goal of \$500,000. Kudos to CVLE members who keep the fundraisers going year after year!

Library staff planned programs around the OneBookAZ digital download program with a "Read, Talk, Go" event for adults and a "Meet the Author" event for teens. Verde Valley Archaeology Director, Ken Zoll led a group of readers on a hike in Cornville. Dewey resident, Garry Rogers answered questions our teens had about his winning book, Cor Syl the Warrior. The State Library reports nearly 5,000 free downloads of the winning OneBookAZ titles which are available for free through the end of May 2014. Ask us how!



It has been our pleasure to have Camp Verde High School senior, Anna McCoy participate in the intern program at the library. Circulation services have been enhanced by Anna's intelligence, her work ethic and positive attitude, her ability to work alone or as part of a team, and her willingness to learn new tasks. As Anna graduates from high school and gets ready for college, we wish her all the best and thank her publicly for the hours of dependable and professional service she has given to the library.

At the end of the month we said, "Happy Retirement" to Miss Nancy McClay, our lovely and beloved story time librarian. Nancy brought a vibrancy and consistency to story times at CVCL from the moment she started as a volunteer. She also stepped up and carried a lot of responsibly while the library was searching for a Youth Services Librarian. She now gets a well-deserved opportunity to read books above a kindergarten level.

Some areas on the Use Statistics I'd like to highlight:

- Staff registered 84 new patrons in May. This is a record for CVCL up almost 2% over FY13.
- Public Internet Computer Use is up 35.3% over FY13.
- Our new online catalog no longer separates patron renewed items from staff renewed items, so it appears that staff is doing more work that we actually are in this area. Not only are patrons handling many renewal themselves by logging into their library accounts, they are using our automated tele-messaging system to renew items by phone.
- Our total circulation is up 33% from May 2013 and just slightly up over FY13. But, note that circulation in Kids & Teen Materials is up 7.9% for the year!
- Filled HOLDS are down 27.3% from FY 2013. Hopefully we are doing a better job putting titles on our shelves that patrons want.
- Figures for incoming and outgoing transits come from the Yavapai Library Network Manager, and are not available to me until after the 10th of each month, leaving us a month behind in getting these figures into the report.
- The number of library programs offered and attendance are up across the board. Of special note is the fact that Youth program attendance increased 108% over May 2013. YS Librarian, Dianna Manasse, ties her programs to literacy encouraging kids to read and it's working as is evidenced by this month's YS Circulation statistics – up 45% over May 2013! This is especially important during Summer Reading Programs starting in June and running through the end of July as illustrated in this clip on [Summer Learning Loss](#).
- One of the reasons we have a larger number of volunteers, is that teens are volunteering their time with us.
- Another aspect of our new online catalog, is that the Library Network can no longer break the use stats down for each library. Once our library website gets rebuilt, we will install a tool such as google analytics to track this information.

A van load of people interested in learning how the Library can partner with higher education to bring both educational and entrepreneurial support to Camp Verde took a day trip to the Phoenix area. We were given a personal tour of ASU Skysong by [Jim Cook](#), Director of Entrepreneurship & Innovation. We stopped by [Scottsdale Public Library Eureka Loft](#) where we learned that participants in programs there have formed 8 new businesses in Scottsdale. After lunch we visited Mesa Public Library's [THINKspot](#) to see how their [Alexandria Co-working Network](#) works. For more information about this trip read the [Library Talk](#) blogpost and/or come to the Spur gathering at Boler's on Wednesday, June 25 at 6 p.m. There our group plus some will reconvene and strategize for CVCL's future partnership with ASU Skysong and what it can mean to Camp Verde.

Camp Verde Library Endowment honored Jim Ash and Carol German for their years of service on the board with a potluck luncheon in the Community Kitchen. The Endowment board will not meet again until the first Thursday in September. The Book Sale is closed in July, but will be open August 7, 2014 from 9a.m – 4p.m.

CVCL received 2,044 donated items at the library in May. Sixty-one of those items were added to our collection and 29 were listed on Amazon for sale. The remainder were taken to CVLE's used book sale at Rio Verde Plaza or place on the Free Shelf on the Library's patio. CVLE's fund with the Arizona Community Foundation has reached over 75% of the endowment's goal of \$500,000. Kudos to CVLE members who keep the fundraisers going year after year!

We kicked off our Summer Reading Program, Fizz Boom Read! at the Ramada on Hollamon Street on June 4. Out of Africa introduced the audience to several of their critters, U.S. Forest Ranger, Mr. Randy, brought animal pelts for us to examine and we introduced Dewey, the bearded dragon, Camp Verde Community Library's newest member. By the end of June we had 115 new people registered for the SRP for a total of 178 participants!



Library Director, Kathy Hellman, was invited to present information to the class at the Library Institute at NAU. The topic was creative STEM/STEAM programming in small rural libraries.

At the beginning of June, Camp Verde Town Maintenance staff installed a people counter on our front door so we can get a more accurate count of the traffic coming into the library. Previously we relied on volunteers and staff to make a tic mark on a calendar for every person who came into the library. The figure you see in the June Traffic Count cell is the number taken from the people counter, divided by 2 with 5% subtracted for library staff coming and going. Clearly we have been underestimating the number of people using Camp Verde Community Library. It will be interesting to see how the numbers play out over the next year.

Our Library Building project momentum was slowed when low-bidder, BEC of Flagstaff pulled their bid requiring us to put the project out to bid again. Council directed the library planning committee to re-evaluate the building design and features to determine possible cost-savings measures before putting the project out to bid again.

Boler's Bar hosted us for a discussion of Skysong and Alexandria Network opportunities through Camp Verde Community Library. We will be forming an advisory committee to investigate how best to apply the Alexandria Co-working Network options to Camp Verde. County Supervisor, Thom Thurman and Yavapai College Small Business Center Development Center Director, Kurt Haskell attended and expressed their support. We appreciate the fact that both of these busy men stayed to the end to hear our Teen Advisory Board teens talk about starting a crowdfunding campaign. Special thanks to Barbara Goetting for supplying so much excellent pizza from The Horn. And, thanks to Steve and Alex Goetting for offering to help guide TAB in their crowdfunding efforts.

Youth Services Librarian, Dianna Manasse and Library Specialist, Gerry Laurito attended the American Library Conference in Las Vegas. Dianna came back with free books, good deals and new ideas for the youth library and Gerry brought back some thoughts about online reference, makerspaces, and library programming.

To get a better idea of the scope of this year's Summer Reading Program, take a look at the attached brochure. YS Librarian, Dianna Manasse, has and is doing excellent work bringing STEM/STEAM programming to life in our community library. We have received positive responses from families attending these programs. Teens have logged 389 hours of reading, Adults have logged 472 items, Tiny Kids have logged 620 minutes, and Kids have logged 234 books so far! What have you been doing with your summer?
