1. **Call to Order**

Mayor German called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. **Roll Call**

Mayor Charles German, Vice Mayor Bruce George (absent), Councilor Robin Whatley, Councilor Jessie Jones-Murdock, Councilor Brad Gordon, Councilor Jackie Baker and Councilor Carol German.

3. **Pledge of Allegiance**

Mayor led the Pledge.

Mayor German evoked a "Point of Personal Privilege". The Mayor put together a statement regarding the loss of civil discourse shown at the last Council Meeting.

Motion was made by Councilor Gordon to approve the Consent Agenda. Second was made by Councilor German. Council unanimously approved the Consent Agenda.

5. **Special Announcements and presentations:**

- Proclamation declaring Saturday, September 24, 2016 as Camp Verde's Arbor Day Celebration 2016
- Proclamation declaring Camp Verde Clean
- Proclamation declaring October of Fort Verde State Historic Park Month

Mayor German read the proclamations by title and gaveled them to be so proclaimed.

6. **Call to the Public for Items not on the Agenda.**

Deb McAshland- is running for re-election for the Yavapai College Governing Board. Ms. Ashland reviewed what she stands for and appreciates the vote.

Tim Wiggle- has 32 yrs of experience running sanitation and recycling programs in Michigan. It was his understanding the Council is looking at different recycling programs and stated he is interested in participating in helping with the research. Mr. Wiggle also stated there is no way to justify the fees that are being charged for solar because there are no building inspections being done. He asked the Council to please review the fee structure. He is currently going through the process and has put in a request for his own solar permit. Mayor German explained to Mr. Wiggle that the fees have been referred back to staff for further review. Councilor Gordon stated that since Mr. Wiggle has expertise and experience with recycling, he asked him to give his contact information to staff.

Mary Webster- newly elected Events Coordinator for the Verde Valley Rangers, stated she wanted to thank the Council for the approval for liquor license.

7. **Community Outreach Presentation by Yavapai College.**

Yavapai College President, Dr. Penny Wills, thanked the Council for their public service. She stated that research shows that people are more likely to engage in their community after taking a minimum of 12 college credits. Dr. Wills stated that she enjoys the Town of Camp Verde atmosphere and said there is so much to be proud of in the community. Dr. Wills passed out and reviewed the Yavapai College Community Update Newsletter and informational booklet.

Councilor Baker asked if there were technical course for adults available at the Verde Campus, for those who are looking to change careers. Dr. Wills said yes, and Yavapai College also offers online classes.

Councilor Whatley asked if there are any plans to build or invest in Camp Verde since it is centrally located. Dr. Wills stated right now on-line classes are the most in demand, there are centers available but she hasn't heard of a brick and mortar buildings scheduled for Camp Verde right now. The college is looking into libraries and schools that would be available for students for online classes. Councilor Whatley stated she is interested in having a center in Camp Verde.

Economic Development Director Steve Ayers stated they are working with the Small Business Development Center at Yavapai College to give them space here in the new library.

8. **Possible Approval of grant application to National Endowment of the Arts for the purpose of constructing a gateway entrance monument to be located at Industrial Drive, to include an in kind match.**

Economic Development Director Steve Ayers explained that over the past year two documents have been approved which called for finally recognizing Camp Verde's place in the geography of the Verde Valley as an entrance point. By applying for the National Endowment of the Arts Grant, there will be assistance with the cost of design, construction, purchase and placement of public art. There are different opportunities coming up, including seven roundabouts planned in different areas, to start the process. With this grant the plan is to place a bronze sculpture, created by Hopi artist Jerry Quotskuyva inside the Industrial Drive roundabout, along with the planned landscaping. The Town can apply the budgeted landscaping costs as its matching portion of the grant. The department has collected several letters of support including one from the Hopi Nation which should help with winning the grant. The estimated cost of adding the statue to the roundabout will be approximately \$20,000.00.

Mr. Ayers stated the application, budget and letters are ready to be submitted with the Council's approval.

Councilor Whatley wanted to clarify that the sign on the sculpture would say Entrance to Camp Verde. Mr. Ayers

confirmed this.

Councilor Murdock asked if this has passed with ADOT requirements and has been discussed with them to make sure it's ok to be in the middle of a roundabout. Mr. Ayers explained that ADOT actually would want to block the view of the other side to help with traffic flow.

Counselor German clarified the \$20,000 is a cash match. Mr. Ayers stated the estimate cash outlay paid by the Town of Camp Verde is \$20,000. Mr. Ayers reviewed the costs and how the Town would plan to match the funds. The Town is applying for a grant totaling \$125,000.

Motion was made by Councilor German to approve the submission for a grant application to National Endowment of the Arts for the purpose of constructing a gateway entrance monument to be located at Industrial Drive, to include an in kind match. Second was made by Councilor Baker. **Motion** carried unanimously.

9. **Discussion, consideration & possible approval for the Finance Director to make the budget adjustments as attached.**

Finance Director Mike Showers explained that making these budget adjustments is something that has been done for the last five years and it is normally done after the fiscal year is over. The adjustments are done in areas of extra expenses. The four areas of adjustments are: Elections- special elections, Legal Fees, Cont. Service Program and IT Services. The balance of Contingency Funds went to cover termination payouts.

Councilor Baker confirmed this is just clearing things up for last fiscal year. Mr. Showers confirmed yes. These items were things each department was working on in the last fiscal year.

Motion was made by Councilor Baker to approve the Finance Director, Mike Showers, to make the budget adjustments as attached. Second was made by Councilor Gordon. **Motion** carried unanimously

10. **Call to the Public for items not on the agenda: NONE**

11. **Council Informational Reports.** These reports are relative to the committee meetings that Council members attend. The Committees are Camp Verde Schools Education Foundation; Chamber of Commerce, Intergovernmental Association, NACOG Regional Council, Verde Valley Transportation Planning Organization, Yavapai County Water Advisory Committee, and shopping locally. Councilor Whatley- promised the Library that she would remind everyone that this Saturday, September 24 at 2pm is the Arbor Day Celebration at the new library. The "Old Guys" planted 30 trees on the site and APS dug all the holes.

Councilor Gordon- went to the Camp Verde Promotions Dinner for the volunteers. He wanted to thank Camp Verde Promotions for a nice dinner. Mr. Gordon also went to the Dedication of the Vets Memorial in Cottonwood. The Mayor bought lunch at the Senior Center. He also attended the Intergovernmental Meeting last Thursday.

Vice Mayor George- Absent

Councilor Baker- attended the 911 Memorial at the Ramada.

Councilor Jones-Murdock- attended the Intergovernmental Meeting in Camp Verde. It was nice that Moscato was able to showcase their food.

Councilor German- attended the Yavapai College Committee Meeting, the Verde Valley Forum and the 911 Memorial, sponsored by the Camp Verde American Legion. Ms. German wanted to thank Maria for organizing the

Promotions Dinner. Councilor German also attended the Intergovernmental Meeting and the Yavapai College Board Meeting.

Mayor German- attended same meetings as Councilor Gordon.

Mayor's Point of Personal Privilege at Council Meeting 9/21/2016

Point of personal privilege: Last Wednesday evening there was an unfortunate display of a loss of civil discourse during our Council meeting. Over the past 3 years we have often discussed, re-read the Code of Conduct for Council and have had various training sessions dealing with those issues. Quite frankly, as Mayor and chairman for Council I certainly cannot control your individual emotions or words with which you choose to communicate to others. I refuse to continue to fight or argue with members of the council as to who did what or how anyone was offended enough to not follow directives from the chair or other council members with a call for "Point of Order". I further refuse to continue to be embarrassed or allow the institution of the Town Council of Camp Verde to be embarrassed by the loss of decorum by any member or members of the Council. We are expected to model the very best for our entire community and in order for us to do so I intend to do the following: When acceptable decorum and civil discourse has been lost during our meetings the chair will immediately recess the meeting for a period of 10 minutes. At the end of the ten minutes the chair will confer with the offending council person or persons to see if they are ready to continue the meeting following proper council decorum and civil discourse. This will also include loss of civil discourse with the citizens who may be in attendance. I remind you, that the Chair has no super powers and the only real option for changing behavior of council members rests with the electorate. I sincerely hope this brings to each of you the seriousness of having to come to this point in conducting ourselves appropriately with each other and with members of our public who may be in attendance.
