The following is the Manager's report regarding activities in the month of July 2013:

New Staff in Building Permitting:

We want to welcome Kendall Welch as the new Permit Tech. in Community Development. This area will also be appearing in front of Council next month or so to discuss and continue to work on finding areas we can address or improve in whatever form our services to the whole community. She joins a staff that works hard daily to serve in the best most efficient way and they are looking forward to discussing and presenting what the next few steps are in that direction and hearing ways the Council and community would like to see.

School Begins in Camp Verde / Community Pool

As schools open across Town it is important to recognize we are attempting to keep the Community Pool Open. We are trying to do so in the mornings until 9 am for exercise, a couple of afternoons, Mon/Wed, and during the weekends to serve the public. This is very difficult to get qualified staff to lifeguard as most of them are back to school or headed that way. With this in mind we hope to operate as possible through September this year.

Council Meetings Media Options

IT has been fine-tuning the media options for viewing live Council meetings via video. To tune-in navigate to <http://www.campverde.az.gov/government/town-clerk/agendas-minutes-actions/town-council>. This is an ongoing effort to cover the council meetings in a way that encourages viewers and hope that someday soon this will allow for live viewing/streaming. Stay tuned, this has caused some technical issues but we hope that this is consistent and better in the near future.

SR 260 widening project (Thousand Trails)

I really appreciate ADOT's efforts and commitment via their 66 million dollar funding allocation to the SR 260 widening project. Now we need to create plan for the next phase; that is meeting with stakeholders (Yavapai County, local communities, the Yavapai Apache Nation, ADOT and interested business and property owners) so we can consider and develop an Access Management Plan (AMP). An AMP is the careful planning for safety, environmental concerns, topography,

location, design, median openings, interchanges, street connections, decel/accel lanes and operation of driveways. There will be tradeoffs of access (some full-access intersections for entry to areas off S260 and economic prosperity) verses mobility. Finally, accommodation for community needs that maximize community benefits. All of the above will need to be fine-tuned before we get to the design/build phase.

Cornfest

Thank you to all the volunteers that helped make the Cornfest a successful event. We all enjoyed the corn, the watermelon and all the other food and activities. The Town was able to enhance the electric to the community field providing more electric power to the vendors, which also benefitted the Cornfest participants. However, none of this including the electrical power upgrades would have been possible without the folks at Camp Verde Promotions who donated \$3000 to help offset some of these costs! Thank you Camp Verde Promotions!

Sedona Recycles Tour

A couple of Council and I were able to go and tour an impressive Sedona Recycles yard that processes all of the collected items from Camp Verde as well as surrounding communities. They do a great job and to see the commitment they have to attempting to recycle every last piece of trash is reassuring and made me appreciate the partnership we have with them.

Monthly Report for July 2013 ~

The second transcriptionist, Rita Severson, began her training at the July 17th meeting. Rita will be providing transcription services for the General Plan Update meetings that are currently scheduled two times per month over the next year or so. Our third transcriptionist that will be placed in the pool is Barbie Bridge. Barbie will begin training at our Work Session that is scheduled for August 14. Sebra will be covering Council meetings, Rita will cover P&Z, and Barbie will cover Work Sessions. You may see each of them switch off at times depending on their schedules. If you have questions or comments, please feel free to talk to them before or after meetings.

We had the final audit for the HOME grant contract #302-11. All went well.

Business Licenses – We processed 15 new business licenses, that included 8 Special Event Vendors, and 24 renewals during the month of July, bringing our total business licenses on file to 650.

Liquor Licenses – We posted two Liquor License Applications in July that will come before Council in August.

Special Events – Staff worked with the promoters for Special Events including Cornfest, and the American Legion 4th of July Celebration and the Corn Festival. Staff worked in conjunction with Camp Verde Promotions to combine the Regular Business License Application and Special Event License Application into one document to minimize the amount of paper work required by the Promoter and Vendors for Special Events. Information Requests/Research Hours – We had six in-house (Staff & Council) requests for information requiring 5 hours of research time, and two public requests.

Citizen Complaints – There was one formal complaint filed in July.

Customer Assistance – The month of July averaged 37 customer assistance contacts per day with a total of 814 phone calls and visitors for the month. We are adding something new this month. We thought that it might be fun to share with you and to memorialize some of the reasons that people call Town Hall. This month we had the usual calls asking for telephone numbers because people do not want to pay for directory assistance. They actually tell us that they pay their taxes and they are entitled to free service. We get calls daily calls for the Chamber of Commerce because their phone has been disconnected. We also get countless numbers of daily calls asking for the Transfer Station, which is a county-owned and operated facility. There are consistent calls from a person about the airplane noise in the Views being worse than Sky Harbor. Then there are people who refuse to deal with voice mail and will call right back to inform us that the person did not answer their phone and want to know why the phones are not being answered. We get calls letting us know that there is no water in the ditch and want the ditch company's number without knowing the name of the ditch. The winner this month was a call from a Rimrock citizen asking for animal control and when we gave them the County number, they asked what department they should ask for. ☺

Meetings – There were five scheduled Council meetings in July, for which we prepared notices, agendas, packets, minutes, addenda, amendments, green sheets, etc. We posted four public notice.

Ordinances and Resolutions – We did not process any new Resolutions or Ordinances during July.

Records Management – The Clerk’s Office staff continues to focus on essential records, The Clerk’s office has a list compiled and distributed to all departments for review. Staff has attended additional training webinars put on by the Arizona State Library, Archives, & Public Records division in July.

**MONTHLY REPORT FOR JULY
BUILDING DIVISION**

The July Safety Committee meeting was cancelled due to the 4th of July Holiday. Held the quarterly Safety meeting for the Community Development Department.

Conducted interviews on June 27th and July 2nd with Mike Jenkins, Community Development Director, Jenna Owens, Assistant Planner and Kristi Gagnon, Camp Verde Fire Marshal with applicants for the Permit Technician/Administrative Assistant position in the Building Division. The Interview Board was unanimous and selected Kendal Welch for the position. Kendall started work on July 15th, and much time for the rest of July was devoted to training her and will continue for the near future. Anyone who has not met Kendall please feel free to come by the office and do so.

Held a pre-development meeting with a developer looking at locating an R.V. Park in Camp Verde. Did research for the Clerk's Office concerning the NACOG Housing program with Camp Verde, and worked with the contractor on a new rehab of a residence, permit was issued.. Held two meetings with Jan Grogan from the new Department of Sanitation and worked out procedures and policies for their review and input on building permit applications. Did the final inspection of the 24,000 sq. ft. arena cover at Jackpot Ranch and consulted with the Finance Department on procedures for paying the Engineering Consultants for the Town. With the special deposit required by the Building division of the applicant cost to the Town for the consulting services were none.

Held meetings with Lisa Diacik, Code Enforcement Officer and Marshal's Deputy Jennifer Zwak concerning a possible dangerous building. Applied for and received an inspection Warrant from the Magistrates Court, executed the Warrant with Officer Diacik, Officer Zwak, Marshal's Office Commander and two other deputies. Building was condemned.

Had several meetings and consultations with the contractors and property owners concerning the new Fed Ex project, permit was issued. Also several meetings and consultations with the developer and contractor for the new commercial building on Boyles Way, permit was issued. Several phone calls and consultations with the Kathy Hellman, Library Director concerning timeline and requirements for the new library building. Inspected the asbestos abatement occurring at the old Marshal's office.

Met with the new Flood Control employee with the County assigned to handle Camp Verde permit applications, Robert McFadden. Worked out procedures and requirements of his office and the needs of the Camp Verde Building Division. Began some preliminary work and conceptual plans on the possible presentation to the Town Council, and possible approval of the 2012 Building Codes by Town Council. This will be a multi-month project with open meetings between staff and public stakeholders beginning in October of this year.

Performed 69 Building Inspections, issued 10 business licenses, 14 miscellaneous site visits, 7 postings for the Clerks' Office, Zoning Division and Building Division. Attended 34 meetings, had 114 phone calls and 16 Plan Reviews.

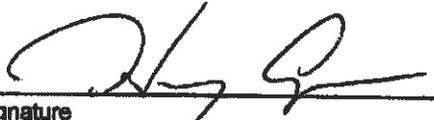

The Library participated in the July 4th Parade down Main Street. We used the opportunity to make contact with local teens and invite them to learn more about the Teen Advisory Board (TAB) application process. Molli distributed posters and information throughout Camp Verde about the upcoming TAB selection process. Inquiries and interest have increased throughout the month and some applications have already been submitted.



Yavapai Free Library District (YFLD) announced a cut in funds going out to public libraries due to a decision by the Yavapai County Supervisors that cut \$600,000 out of YFLD's FY2014 budget. CVCL will receive \$14,537 less in FY14 than in FY13 from YFLD funds.

Kathy Hellman and Steve and Alex Goetting had a phone interview with Tracy Lea and Jim Cook of [Skysong](#) to explore the possibility of CVCL having an [Alexandria Network](#) location in the new library. The Alexandria Network comes from [ASU's Venture Catalyst](#) department and provides connections and support for entrepreneurial efforts through public libraries. CVCL and the CV Chamber of Commerce are considering a collaborative effort as we learn more about the Alexandria Network at a September 20 training event in Scottsdale.

Gerry Laurito, volunteer Ann Rasor and Kathy Hellman were taught the basics of original cataloging by Megan Hammond, YFLD. Many new items added to CVCL's shelves already have bibliographic records in the Yavapai Library Network's system. However, original bibliographic records must be created for local authors', musicians' and filmmakers' work. This training will allow us to better meet our goal of collecting works by local artists.

Damage Control, LLC out of Mesa began asbestos abatement on the Library Annex building at 33 W Moser Lane on July 25. The job took longer than predicted because a second ceiling with “popcorn” finished tiles was discovered several feet above the visible ceiling. Damage Control removed all the infected material and the building passed inspection on July 31. It has been covered with graffiti as a fundraiser for CCCVL and will be used for SWAT training exercises before demolition begins September 12.

CVCL collaborated with CV Parks and Recreation in a Teen Pool Party event at the Town pool. Teens were admitted at no charge when they filled out a short survey about the TAB and other town events aimed at teens. Food was provided by the library and lifeguards were provided by Parks & Recreation. Teens who came had a blast! The Library and Parks & Recreation are discussing more collaborative efforts in upcoming months.

CVCL’s Children’s Summer Reading Program (SRP) concluded on July 30 with a grand finale performance by Sticks and Tones. Thanks are again due Mike Marshall and CV Parks & Recreation for facilitating the Children’s Library’s use of the Town Gym. The Teen SRP ended August 1 with an Ice Cream Sundae Social at the library. Prizes for the Teen Awards drawing went to:
