

ORDINANCE 92-A77

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CAMP VERDE, YAVAPAI COUNTY, ARIZONA PROVIDING FOR THE DIRECT ELECTION OF THE MAYOR BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS, SETTING THE LENGTH OF THE TERM OF THE MAYOR AND MODIFYING RESOLUTION 89-85.

Section 1. Direct Election of Mayor

A. Commencing with the primary and general elections of 1995, the Mayor shall be directly elected by the people by a majority vote of the qualified electors. Pursuant to ARS 9-821.01 and Ordinance 86-A01, any candidate who receives a majority of all votes cast at the primary election shall be declared Mayor effective as of the date of the general election, and no further election shall be held as to such candidate.

B. The term of the Mayor shall be for two (2) years, and Resolution 89-85 is modified accordingly. The Council shall select a Vice mayor as set forth in ARS 9-232.C and Resolution 89-95, to assume the duties in the absence, disqualification, or resignation of the Mayor. In every election one of the declared vacancies on the Council shall be reserved for the election of the Mayor.


C. A candidate may not run for both Mayor and Councilmember at the same election.

D. A Mayor may not immediately succeed himself or herself in office more than once.


Section 2. Ratification by Election.

The provisions of this ordinance shall not become effective until after the Council has duly declared that the question of the direct election of the Mayor shall come before the qualified voters of the Town at a Special or General Election, and the voters by a majority give their approval.


