## **IMPORTANT VOTING INFORMATION**

The November 3, 2020 General election will NOT be run as a "Vote-by-Mail" election. In place of voters being limited to one designated "polling place" location, voters may vote at any "Vote Center" in Yavapai County or may request to receive their ballots by mail.

**Who may vote in Camp Verde:** A person is entitled to vote in the Election who has resided in the boundaries of the Town for **Twenty-Nine (29)** days preceding the Election, who is qualified to register to vote as provided in Arizona Revised Statutes Section 16-101.

**Voter Registration:** In order to vote in any election, you must live in the jurisdiction's limits and you must have registered to vote at least 29 days prior to an election. If you do not know if you are qualified to vote, contact the Yavapai County Elections Department at the telephone number indicated below.

### **Requirements for Registering to Vote**

- You must be a citizen of the United States
- 18 Years of age or older preceding the next General Election
- A resident of the State 29 days preceding the next General Election
- Have not been convicted of a felony or treason, if so, your civil rights have been restored

### **Early Voting**

#### **Offices designated for Early Voting:**

- Yavapai County Administration Building – 1015 Fair Street – Prescott, AZ
- Yavapai County Cottonwood Annex Building – 10 S 6<sup>th</sup> Street-Cottonwood, AZ

**Voting Early in person:** Appear at an Office Designated for Early Voting no later than the close of business on the last day to vote in person. Early Voting will be permitted Monday through Friday during Regular business hours.

**Voting Early by mail:** Written or verbal requests must be received in an Office Designated for Early Voting before the close of business on the last day to request. Specify where to mail the ballot. Include name, residence address, birth date, election for which the ballot is being requested, address where ballot is to be mailed if other than residence address and signature of requester.

**To the Voters of Town of Camp Verde**

On November 3, 2020 the Town of Camp Verde will conduct a General Election to submit Proposition 452, a Resolution proposing a Permanent Adjustment to the State-Imposed Base Expenditure Limitation for the Town of Camp Verde.

Vote Centers for the Election will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on November 3, 2020. Voters in Yavapai County may choose any Vote-Center wherein they wish to cast their ballot. Voters may also vote early in-person or request an absentee ballot be mailed to them. You may contact Yavapai County Election Office at (928) 639-8100, or go to the County Recorder's Office located at 10 S. Sixth Street, Cottonwood, Arizona. In order to be counted, voted ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m. on November 3, 2020.

A voter in this election must be a qualified elector of the Town of Camp Verde. A qualified elector of the Town is defined as a person, eighteen years or older, whose name appears on the Yavapai County voter registration roll in a precinct of the Town of Camp Verde at least twenty-nine (29) days prior to the date of election. Voter registration cutoff for this election is October 5, 2020.

It is important for the Yavapai County Elections Office to have your **CURRENT** information on file. If you change your name or your residential address, you must reregister to vote by October 5, 2020. To determine if your registration is current, please contact the Yavapai County Elections Office at (928) 639-8100, or go to the County Recorder's Office located at 10 S. Sixth Street, Cottonwood, Arizona.

Preparation of this Informational Pamphlet is required by State Law and in compliance with the Federal Voting Rights Act. In order to be prepared to fully exercise your right to vote at the Election, you are urged to thoroughly read all the material. This Information Pamphlet may be taken into the voting booth on the day of the Election.

The information pamphlet contains a summary of the measure, ballot format, Official titles, descriptive titles, the effect of a "YES" or a "NO" vote, and the arguments for and against Proposition 452.

## **PERMANENT BASE ADJUSTMENT SUMMARY ANALYSIS**

Pursuant to the Arizona State Constitution, the Town of Camp Verde seeks voter approval to permanently adjust the expenditure base of the Town as determined by the Economic Estimates Commission. If approved by the voters, the Town's 1979-80 base expenditure limitation will be increased by \$565,000 adjusted each future year for population and inflation growth since 1979-80.

With voter approval, in 2021-2022 the Town's expenditure limitation will increase by \$3,576,382, from \$13,116,221 to \$16,692,603. The Town will utilize the additional expenditure authority for any local budgetary purposes including expenses for the Town's wastewater and water systems. (The dollar figures in this statement are estimates only.)

If approved, the additional authorized expenditures will be funded from revenues obtained from local sources.

## **PERMANENT BASE ADJUSTMENT DETAILED ANALYSIS**

Pursuant to the Arizona State Constitution, the Town of Camp Verde, Arizona as authorized by Resolution #2020-1046 passed on June 17, 2020 will seek voter approval to permanently adjust the expenditure base of the Town as determined by the Economic Estimates Commission.

With voter approval, the Town will permanently increase the 1979-80 expenditure base of the Town by \$565,000 beginning in fiscal year 2021-2022 and utilize the additional expenditure authority for all local budgetary purposes including expenses for the Town's wastewater and water systems.

If approved, the additional expenditures authorized will be funded from revenue obtained from federal, state and local sources. In 2021-2022, the Town's expenditure limitation will increase by \$3,576,382, from \$13,116,221 to \$16,692,603 in Fiscal Year 2021-2022, \$0 of the revenue required to fund the additional authorized expenditures will be obtained from federal sources while \$0 will be acquired through state sources and the remaining \$3,576,382 will be funded through local revenue sources. All dollar figures in this analysis are estimates only.

In determining the revenue sources to fund the authorized additional expenditures, it is assumed that the federal, state and local revenues received by the Town will continue to be available and increase as they have for the past 5 years. In the past 5 years, federal revenue has increased by approximately 0% each year while state revenue has increased by approximately 0% and local revenue has increased by approximately 5.4% each year.
